About the Program Model

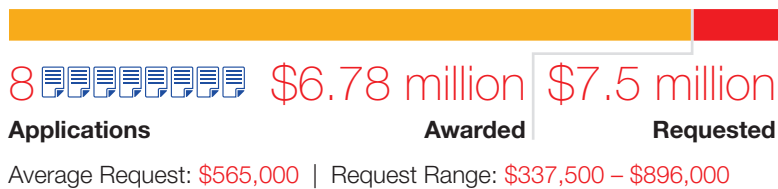

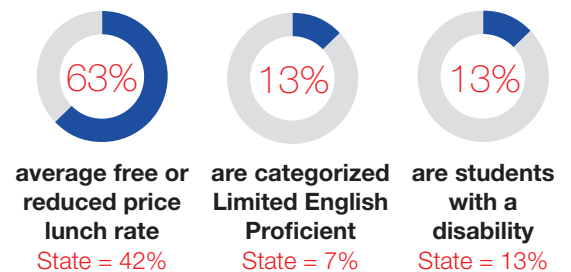

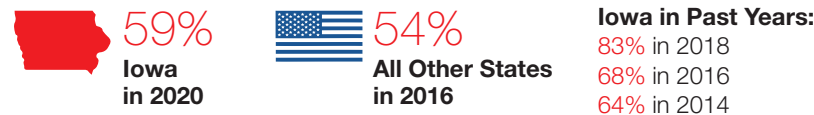

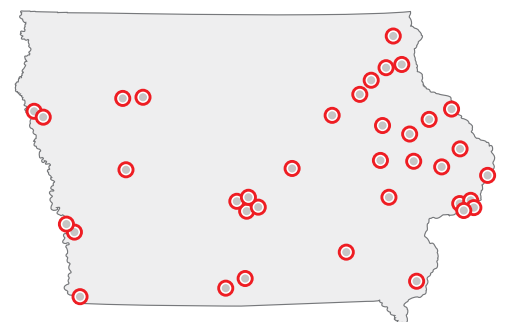

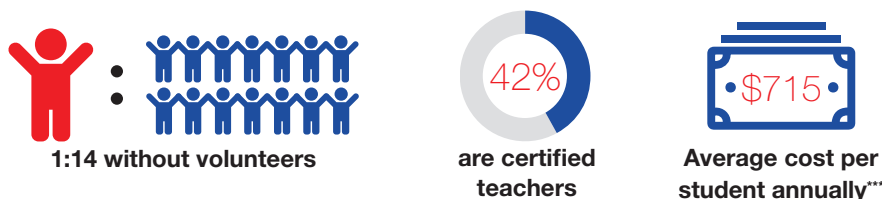
Regular Attendance*
